India is a subcontinent consisting of many local countries. The best way to experience India is through its culture, tradition, history and mythology. India is associated with those who have not yet visited it with a variety of images and associations: magnificent palaces of Maharajas, impressive with their treasures, compared to beggars asking for alms or lying on the streets of the cities. In India there are great plains of dry and arid desert and savanna, rain forests on the slopes of the snow-covered Himalayas, tigers and elephants, silk and the sounds of the sitar and the table, scents in the sky and incense, and statues of gods and goddesses. It has large and crowded markets, colorful costumes and foods in different flavors. All these and more make up this huge and complicated country, the largest by population in the world.
Rajastan is a state in northern India. It covers 342,239 square kilometres (132,139 sq mi) or 10.4 per cent of India's total geographical area. Rajasthan means "The Land of Kings" (Raja in Sanskrit). The Mughal Empire ruled this area since the 16<sup>th</sup> century to the 18<sup>th</sup> century, they were very good warriors. The British empire took control of the region in 1818, and gave the rulers of the region a degree of autonomy. Many palaces of local Maharajas are located in this area, to show their wealth.

# DETAILED PROGRAM

# Day 01, (Monday) : Arrive Delhi (By Flight)

<u>**Delhi-**</u> Delhi is a city that bridges two different worlds. **Old Delhi,** once the capital of Islamic India, is a labyrinth of narrow lanes lined with crumbling havelis and formidable mosques. In contrast, the imperial city of **New Delhi** created by the British Raj is composed of spacious, tree-lined avenues and imposing government buildings. Delhi has been the seat of power for several rulers and many empires for about a millennium. Many a





times the city was built, destroyed and then rebuilt here. Interestingly, a number of Delhi's rulers played a dual role, first as destroyers and then as creators.

Traditional welcome by our executive on your arrival at Delhi International airport followed by proceeds for proceed to hotel.

Later start city tour visiting Old Delhi, **drive past Red Fort**, constructed in 1639 AD, this UNESCO World Heritage Site will amaze you with what you find inside it today. Visit nearby **Jama Masjid Mosque**, the largest in India, has a courtyard that can hold 25,000 worshippers. Followed **by Rickshaw ride**.

Later visit to **Rajghat**, the site of Mahatma Gandhi's cremation and a memorial to this humble man who so changed the world. Further we explore India's bustling capital city the New Delhi visiting the **Vijay Chowk**, "**Victory Square**", stopover at the Presidential Palace with its intriguing combination of classical and Indian design elements and the **India Gate** memorializing Indian soldiers who died in World War I.



Also visit **Qutab-Minar** in red and buff sandstone is the highest tower in India. It has a diameter of 14.32 m at the base and about 2.75 m on the top with a height of 72.5 m.

# Day 02, (Tuesday) : Delhi-Udaipur

Morning after breakfast proceed to visit **Lotus Temple** -This temple is built in the shape of a lotus flower and is the last of seven Major Bahai's temples built around the world. Completed in1986 it is set among the lush green landscaped gardens.

Later on time transfer to Delhi domestic airport to connect the flight for Udaipur. Arrive Udaipur airport and drive to city for panoramic tour.

After tour, check-in at hotel. Evening drive Tuk-Tuk ride to visit local old city market of Udaipur. Further enjoy Bagore Ki Haveli Puppet & Dance show.

# Day 03, (Wednesday) : Udaipur

<u>**Udaipur</u>** is a beautiful city, set amidst the Aravalli Ranges of Rajasthan, India. Known for its picturesque lakes, Udaipur also called 'the city of lakes'. The elevated hills and the beautiful lakes make a picture-perfect</u>

backdrop to the Udaipur city. Udaipur is regarded as one of the most romantic cities of the World and subsequently, also known as the 'Venice of East'. In context of Rajasthan, Udaipur is the second most-sought after tourist destination of the state, the first being Jaipur. Udaipur had been the capital of Mewar for centuries.

Morning proceed for the sightseeing tour of Udaipur visiting **City Palace** built in 1725; the grand City Palace is actually a conglomerate of eleven palaces overlooking the sprawling **Lake Pichola**. One of the largest, most beautiful palaces in the state of Rajasthan, it is now a museum, royal residence and a luxury hotel. This intricately designed monument is an architectural wonder in granite and marble.

Later proceed to visit **Sahelion-Ki-Bari**, consisting of an ornamental pool with delicately carved cenotaphs of black and white marble and soft stone.

Further enjoys a **Boat Ride on LAKE PICHOLA** with its main attractions being the two palaces on the islands in the lake, Jagniwas and **JAGMANDIR** Lake Pichola is about 4 km in length and 3 km. wide. Jagniwas was earlier the summer retreat of the prince of Mewar and now a five-star hotel. The city palace extends along the eastern shore of the lake.

# Day 04, (Thursday) : Udaipur-Ranakpur-Jodhpur

**Jodhpur** is the second-largest city in the Indian state of Rajasthan and officially the second metropolitan city of the state. Jodhpur was historically the capital of the Kingdom of Marwar, which is now part of Rajasthan. Featuring many palaces, forts, and temples, set in the stark landscape of the Thar Desert. It is popularly known as the **"Blue City"** among people of Rajasthan and all over India.

Morning after breakfast drive to Jodhpur, en-route visit Jain temples at Ranakpur which are beautifully preserved and are renowned for their intricate carvings and architecture. The most prominent temple, built in 1439, is the Adinatha which is symmetrically planned around the central shrine and has numerous spires, gateways and porches.

Arrive Jodhpur and proceed for Bishnoi Village by Jeep an ancient and special tribal village of Jodhpur. Bishnoi village minorities live – weavers, potters and tribbles of gypsies. This tribal village still preserves a unique and authentic lifestyle and its people love the natural with zeal and dedicate their lives to preserve it. The local people of tribe would view a visitor with great wonder and curiosity, just as we view them. Later check-in at hotel.

# Day 05, (Friday) : Jodhpur-Pushkar

Morning after breakfast proceed to visit the massive **Mehrangarh Fort**-The most magnificent fort in Jodhpur is the Mehrangarh Fort. It is situated on a 150m high hill. Rao Jodha, the then chief of Rathore clan, constructed it in 1459. There are a number of attractions within the fort like several palaces, galleries, a museum, and temples.

Later drive to Pushkar. Arrive and check-in at hotel. Evening on time visit Chabbad House for Shabbat prayer and meal.

**Pushkar** is a pilgrimage site for Hindus and Sikhs. Pushkar is located on the shore of Pushkar Lake, which has many ghats where pilgrims bathe. It has many temples, and is considered a sacred city by the Hindus. Pushkar is famous for its annual fair (Pushkar Camel Fair) featuring a trading fete of cattle, horses and camels, which iis held in October or November and attracts nearly 200,000 people.

# Day 07 (Sunday): Pushkar- JaipurMorning enjoy Camel Safari. Later drive to Jaipur.

**Jaipur** is the capital of the state of Rajasthan popularly also known as the 'PINK CITY' as the buildings in its old, walled city are all constructed in pink-colored sandstone. Jaipur owes its name, its foundation and its careful planning to the great warrior-astronomer Maharaja Jai Singh II (1699-1744). He laid out the city with its surrounding walls and six rectangular blocks by principles of town planning set out in an ancient Hindu treatise on architecture. In 1728 he constructed the remarkable observatory, which is still one of Jaipur central attractions.

Arrive Jaipur and proceed to visit **Birla Temple -** It was built by one of the famous business families of India, the Birla family, who were given this land by the Maharaja of Jaipur for a token sum of one rupee. The B.M Birla Foundation built the temple on this land in 1988.

Later check-in at hotel. Evening enjoy Bollywood Movie show at Raj Mandir. Overnight stay at hotel

# Day 08 (Monday) : Jaipur

Morning after breakfast proceeds to start an excursion to the splendid **Amber Fort**, an architectural masterpiece of great historical significance. Begun in the 16th century and built of red sandstone and marble, the seemingly rough exterior gives no hint of the warm and opulent ambiance of the interior, as you'll discover this morning. Here you also get an opportunity to climb up to the fort on decorated **Elephant Back**.

In the afternoon also visit the splendid City Palace & Museum which opens a door into the opulent world of the Rajput princes and the treasures with which they surrounded themselves.

The City Palace Complex is home to several palatial buildings constructed by influential rulers that reflect the blending of Rajasthani and Mughal architectural styles. Maharaja Jai Singh II built Jantar Mantar, the world's biggest stone observatory, between 1727 and 1733 AD. You'll be amazed by the "tools" he used to study the heavens – and that still provide accurate information today – during a tour.

Further visit the Palace of Winds also known as Hawa Mahal, a five storeyed wonder with a spectacular pyramidal facade and overhanging windows with latticed screens, domes and spires.

# Day 09 (Tuesday) : Jaipur-Agra

Morning after breakfast drive to Agra, en-route visit Abhaneri Step well-This is famous for the deepest step well in world. The well is located opposite to a temple known as Harshat Mata temple. It is believed that the Chand Baori step well has some religious connection and that's the reason to build it in front of the temple.

Arrive Agra and visit the red sandstone Agra Fort, which stands like a crescent on the banks of the Jamuna River enclosed by forbidding 20-meter high walls, with a 12- meter moat between them. Three successive Mughal emperors - Akbar, Jehangir and Shah Jehan - helped create this massive structure which contains Hindu and Muslim architecture.

Completed in 1652, skilled craftsmen from Persia, Turkey, France and Italy and some 20,000 labourers worked for 17 years to build this edifice, constructed by Emperor Shah Jehan as a mausoleum for his beloved queen Mumtaz Mahal.

Later drive to Delhi, upon arrival proceed to **visit local Synagogue and local market**.



After tour, on time transfer to Delhi Int'l airport to connect the flight for way back to home.
